The annual **Salute to Catholic School Alumni Dinner** has once again shattered its previous record, with **net proceeds of just over \$600,000**. 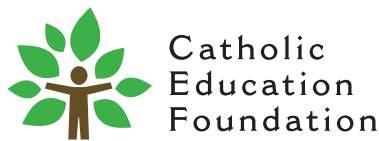

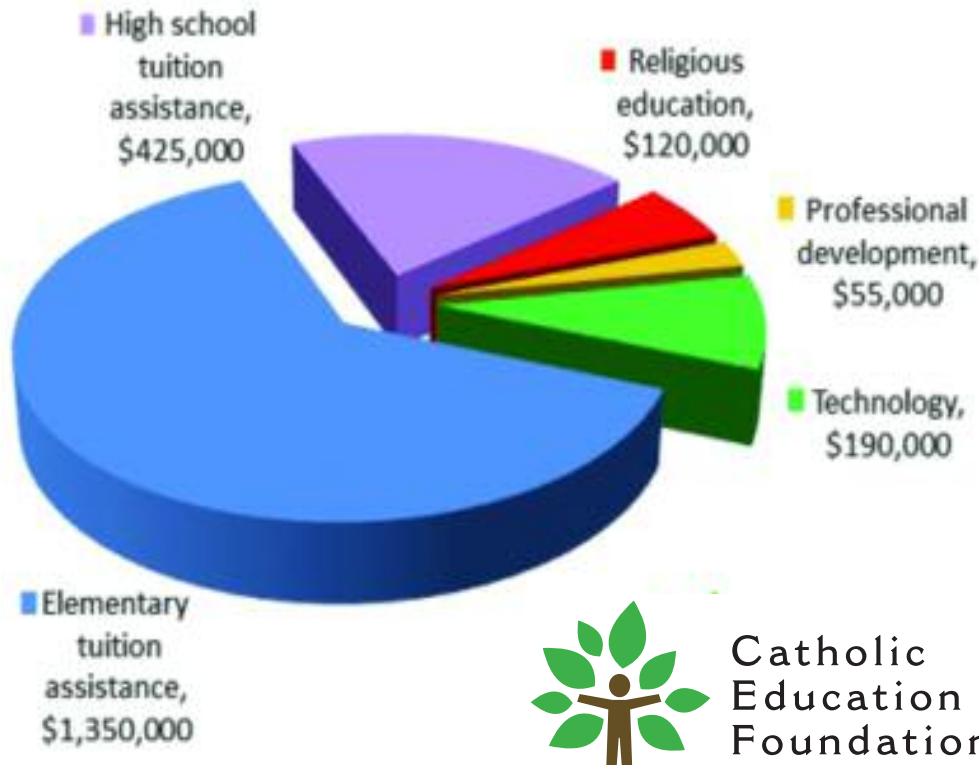
