

## Official Rules and Regulations

The sponsor of *THE GAME Split The Pot Raffle* is the Catholic Education Foundation, Inc., of Louisville, Kentucky ("CEF"), a 501(c)3 organization located at 401 West Main Street, Suite 806, Louisville, Kentucky 40202; Kentucky Gaming License #: ORG0002777. The location of the drawing is 428 South Fourth Street, Suite 252, Louisville, KY. All proceeds of the raffle will benefit CEF.

*THE GAME Split the Pot Raffle* tickets will be sold from August 20, 2025, at 10:00 AM EDT until September 25, 2025, at 2:00 PM EDT. The drawing will take place on September 26, 2025, at 10:35 AM EDT on CEF's Facebook Live page which can be accessed at [www.facebook.com/ceflou](https://www.facebook.com/ceflou). The winners will be announced at that time.

Tickets are \$25 each and you must be 18 years or older to purchase. There is no limit on the number of tickets purchased by a single individual. An email for your purchase of raffle ticket(s) will be sent after the purchase with your raffle number(s). Residents in the continental US, where not prohibited by law, are eligible. An affidavit of eligibility may be required from the winner. Foundation employees and their immediate family members (family members living in the same home) are not eligible to purchase tickets.

The raffle prize will be fifty percent (50%) of the gross revenue of ticket sales. The prize is not transferable and will be paid by check to the winner. The winner is responsible for any applicable taxes. The winner has thirty (30) calendar days from the announcement to claim the prize.

By purchasing a ticket, each Ticket Holder releases the CEF, its directors, officers, employees, and agents from any and all liability for injuries, losses, or damages of any kind and agrees to hold CEF harmless from any and all losses, damages, rights, and claims by participation in *THE GAME Split the Pot Raffle*. Each ticket holder agrees to his or her name, photograph, voice, and/or likeness being utilized for advertising and publicity purposes without prior approval and without compensation to the ticket holder. Additionally, purchasing a ticket provides consent to opt in and receive marketing emails and solicitations from the CEF.

Per the Internal Revenue Service, ticket purchases do not qualify for charitable deductions.
