## HIGH SCHOOL FUNDING TO DOUBLE IN FIVE YEARS!

For many years, the Archdiocese of Louisville and the Foundation have teamed up annually to provide tuition assistance block grants to the nine Catholic high schools in central Kentucky. This program supplements the work of each school in raising funds for tuition assistance, allowing each school to distribute these funds to their students most in need.

The block grants vary in amount by school, depending on their own resources and the needs of each student body. Last fall, the aggregate block grants were a record \$650,000, with the archdiocese providing \$500,000 and the balance by the Foundation.

Under a new plan that began in September, this program is expected to double over the next five years to

#### **Capital Campaign Reaches \$86 Million!!**

The Foundation's historic capital campaign, publicly announced at the 2025 Salute to Catholic School Alumni dinner event last March, is rolling toward its once unthinkable goal of **\$100 million!** 

Cumulative commitments to the campaign now stand at **\$86 million** and the Foundation staff is gearing up as we enter the final stretch of this unprecedented endeavor.

Foundation **Vice President Julie Baum** exclaimed, "Campaign donors can choose from three giving options – or even better, all of them! Of the \$86 million in commitments so far, approximately \$42 million relate to our Annual Fund, another \$21 million have been designated to fund our endowment, and \$23 million of gifts have been included in donor's estate plans. What a fantastic show of support for Catholic education across central Kentucky!"

Ms. Baum continued, "This fall, we're already seeing the fruits of the campaign. Our elementary tuition assistance funding hit a new **record high \$8.6 million**, and our high school tuition assistance program funding will **double** over the next five years!! How **AWESOME** is that!!"

**Rich Lechleiter** remarked, "This capital campaign is truly a game-changer for both the Foundation and the families we support. And we couldn't be more excited about how our donors have embraced our simple campaign slogan, "The Answer is Yes! For Everyone. Forever." The record \$8.6 million of funding was provided by the Foundation (\$4.7 million), parishes and schools (\$2.3 million), and the 107 parishes of the Archdiocese of Louisville, along with Community Catholic Center, (\$1.6 million).

Foundation Board Chair **Joe Landenwich** commented, "While we are elated that the Foundation and our partners are supporting families like never before, our work never ceases. Each day, families in need are reaching out to us in search of a Catholic education that they can't afford for their children. To each of them, our reply is always the same. "The Answer is Yes!"

This year's scholarship grants pushed the Foundation over the 50,000 mark since it awarded its first scholarships in 1999. Mr. Lechleiter reflected, "In 1999, we awarded \$110,000 in scholarships to 220 students. Who would have ever dreamed that our donors would elevate our mission to such heights? Thanks be to God and to each and every one of them!"

**Julie Baum** commented, "I couldn't be more proud of our 48 Catholic primary and secondary schools across central Kentucky! What a huge debt of gratitude we owe to our priests, administrators, teachers, counselors, coaches and staff! 



# Fifth Annual Bourbon Raffle to Launch May 2026


